The CARMA Final Conference is here!

The conference will be held on 4th October at the <u>Royal Library of Belgium Meeting Center</u>, in Brussels and on 5th October, educational visits will take place across Brussels. On World Teacher's Day, the conference will bring together teachers, educational staff, policy makers and stakeholders in school education from various European countries for a two-day interactive programme.

Under the Motto "Collaborative Learning as a Road towards Educational Success", the first day will allow participants to engage in fruitful discussions, learning from the CARMA impact to innovate education using non-formal methods. On the 2nd day, participants will be invited to take part in visits to school institutions to see examples of non-formal learning practices in the school environment.
